According to Stats Canada, caregivers of children or spouses were also more likely to sustain an injury while providing care. Half have experienced financial difficulties and say they would like more help. Many reported symptoms of psychological distress such as depression, feelings of isolation and disturbed sleep. Despite it all, 90% of caregivers still felt that the experience of providing care was rewarding. 70% said their relationship with their care receiver had strengthened over the previous year.
